### [Question]

Some families let their older kids, when they are at home, take care of the younger kids. Do you think this is a good practice?

### [Response]

The most typical structure of a family is parents who lead and kids who follow. However, there are also many families who give a lot of leadership responsibility to the older kids in the family. The older kids might be responsible for feeding the younger kids or for taking them to school, and so on. I argue that it's a great idea to have older kids help raise the younger kids.

First off, it's healthy for the younger kids. Little kids need individual attention. It's not easy to get that in a big family, but it helps to have the older siblings help take care of the younger siblings. For example, my sister received a lot of attention from our parents because she was their first kid. However, I'm the youngest kid, so my parents had to split attention between me and all



the other kids at the same time. My sister did a lot to help take care of me, and that was a major benefit to me. It's almost like she was a third parent.

Another point, and quite an obvious one, is that it helps the parents out a lot if the older kids can help take care of the younger kids. Life is stressful, so splitting up the responsibility makes it less of a burden for everyone. I grew up living in a rural area, and it was a huge help to the entire family when my sister was old enough to drive. It was a major time commitment for my parents to drive all the kids to band practice, karate lessons, and soccer games because both of my parents worked full-time. After my older sister started helping out, my parents' lives became so much easier.

For my final point, I'd argue that it's even beneficial for the older kids when they help to raise the younger kids. It might not always be fun for them, but it helps them to become more responsible and it teaches them leadership skills. My best friend is the oldest child in his family. He often helps his younger siblings with their homework and looks after them when his parents aren't home. I notice that this has made him into a natural leader. Even in group projects at school, he's become very good at leading groups and helping everyone get organized. He might not always enjoy looking after his siblings, but someday he'll thank his parents for helping him to be a responsible person.

In short, a lot of good comes out of the situation when siblings help



siblings. I think it's a strategy that all parents of big families should use.
