[Response]

[Question]

Many schools require young children (aged 5-11) to study together in small groups instead of studying alone. Do agree or disagree with the following statement? Requiring children to study in groups is the best way to teach them. Why?

[Response]

There are many different philosophies in education, but one of the most common debates is whether it's better to have students study alone or in small groups while in class. I'm sure there are pros and cons on both sides, but I believe that working in small groups is going to benefit students more than working alone.

First off, studying in small groups helps students to develop a better understanding of the subject. Students usually don't understand everything about a subject the first time they learn about it. By working in small groups, students are able to help each other quickly figure out things they didn't



understand before, and everyone in the group comes out knowing more than they did before. This could be especially true in language classes. Perhaps one student remembers the rules for the grammar, but doesn't remember the right words to use. Another student remembers the vocabulary, but doesn't remember how to put them into a sentence. These students would learn more by working in a group than they would by working solo.

Secondly, school isn't just about knowledge; it's also a place for us to develop our social skills. Obviously, working in a group is vastly superior to working alone for improving our social skills. Students might spend a lot of time with their friends outside of class, but that's a very different experience from working with a group in a classroom setting. In the classroom, students will be working with a random group of other students and not just their friends. They'll also have an objective to be working towards. The skills needed for this sort of social interaction are the same skills they'll need to be successful in their future workplaces. If the purpose of school is to prepare students to have successful careers, then it's necessary that they learn to work in groups.

Finally, working in groups is just flat out more fun. This isn't a trivial point; students will learn more in a class when they're having fun. When I was a student, we usually studied alone and I spent a lot of time feeling bored. I'd daydream or I'd look out the window. Either way, my mind wouldn't be



focused on what's going on in class. Working with a group is more interesting because you're talking with people and working on something. When students are interested, they're having fun. When they're having fun, they're focusing on class.

In short, teachers should try to include more small group work in their classes. It helps students learn, better prepares them for their futures, and it's just simply more fun.
