[Response]

Kids need to learn all sorts of things. On top of technical things like how to ride a bike and how to tie their shoes, they also need to learn soft skills to make them grow into responsible adults that work well in society. Of the soft skills, I believe that the most important thing to teach them is to be honest people.

First off, honesty is necessary for building strong relationships. They say that trust is the foundation of every relationship, and I firmly believe that.
